The Personal Meaning of Easter

I'm writing this article on the feast of St Joseph the Worker, in the month of Our Lady.

Something that helps me at the core of my walk in Faith is the real assistance of the Communion of Saints. Those who came before us in faith, now in Heaven, are available to us for intercessory prayer.

This is an enormous help for us in our many needs. Of course we ask for help from God directly; but "we do not pray as we ought." (ROM 8: 26-28)

It seems that there are so many things we do to maintain our Christian Life. We attend Mass and related prayer services/events. We go to Confession more regularly and receive authoritative mercy, restoration and Grace. We attend adoration, practice daily prayer times, and more.

I have begun, during morning prayer time, to follow the listed feast days of the lives of the Saints, reading their short life summaries. I ask them to pray for me and for our intentions.

Because their prayers are "perfect" I know that they are heard. Our prayers, although imperfect, are still heard. Isn't it best to "know someone?" Having "connections" is a real, practical advantage and help.

We have "friends in high places" with the Saints in Heaven. They are free to intercede for us.

Our greatest Saints are the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph.

As a matter of fact, Mary is, by far, the greatest of the Saints. A distant second is St. Joseph, greater than all the other saints by a wide margin!

Although this hierarchy is difficult to comprehend, it is simple to ask for their prayers.

Is there difficulty and brokenness in your family? Pray to Saint Joseph.

Are you or someone you love in BIG trouble? Plead to Our Lady.

Make friends with other Saints. I love Saint Pio of Pietrelcina and Saint André Bessette.

The Saints: perfect friends that pray for us perfectly!

Dear Brothers,

The church has given us the opportunity this year to prepare to live our faith, pondering the importance of the Eucharist for our lives. The year of Eucharistic Revival in the Parishes has been a great opportunity to connect with our own vocation, as the Supreme Knight, Patrick E. Kelly, reminded us by inviting us to become Knights of the Eucharist: "As Catholics and as Knights, the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life – in all that we do, the root of our strength. When we receive our Lord in Holy Communion, we are fed, then sent forth to be Christ's emissaries to those we encounter".¹

Assuming the mission of strengthening our families keeping them united to Jesus, we have begun this month by surrendering in adoration before the Most Holy Sacrament, reflecting on the graces with which God has endowed the Just Man, and entrusting ourselves to his protection so that by his example we know how to protect our own families. In the Church's teachings we found:

Exercising his paternal care over Jesus, Saint Joseph of Nazareth, set over the Lord's family, marvelously fulfilled the office he received by grace. Adhering firmly to the mystery of God's design of salvation in its very beginnings, he stands as an exemplary model of the kindness and humility that the Christian faith raises to a great destiny, and demonstrates the ordinary and simple virtues necessary for men to be good and genuine followers of Christ.²

In this way we connect with the challenge of the month of Mary presented to us by the Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori: "I challenge you to pray the rosary daily with your entire household, offering at least one decade for the unity of your family and the Church". For this objective, let us meditate on the relationship between the love we profess for our Mother and Eucharistic adoration.

From the relationship between the Eucharist and the individual sacraments the Christian life emerges, a life called at all times to be an act of spiritual worship, a self-offering pleasing to God. Although we are all still journeying towards the complete fulfilment of our hope, this does not mean that we cannot already gratefully acknowledge that God's gifts to us have found their perfect fulfilment in the Virgin Mary, Mother of God and our Mother... every time we approach the Body and Blood of Christ in the eucharistic liturgy, we also turn to her who, by her complete fidelity, received Christ's sacrifice for the whole Church...She is the Immaculata, who receives God's gift unconditionally and is thus associated with his work of salvation. Mary of Nazareth, icon of the nascent Church, is the model for each of us, called to receive the gift that Jesus makes of himself in the Eucharist.³

We continue to persevere in prayer in the company of Mary, so that the gifts of the Holy Spirit are activated in us and we can be righteous men like Saint Joseph, so that our lives can preach: Vivat Jesus!

My Brothers in Faith,

The following article is from Word Among Us, the April 22 Meditation:

Acts 11:1-18

What God has made clean, you are not to call profane. (Acts 11:9)

In today's first reading, Peter explains a vision that at first confused him—God seemed to be telling him to eat unclean foods. But Peter tells James and the other leaders of the Church that he now understands that his vision was about much more than food.

God knew the challenges that lay ahead as Gentiles became believers. So, he gave Peter a vision that was meant to soften his heart toward the Roman soldier Cornelius and open his eyes to the work of the Spirit among the Gentiles. It was Cornelius and his family that God wanted Peter to see as no longer "profane." He wanted him to call them brothers and sisters who also had a place in the kingdom (Acts 10:15, 22-49). And because Peter obeyed, the whole Church was transformed: Jews and Gentiles came together to live as the redeemed family of God.

God used Peter's vision to help believers recognize their imperfect mindsets and bring them into alignment with his way of thinking. This vision also gave them a new way of relating to the world and a new way to speak about each other.

Just as he did with Peter, God wants to help us recognize where our mindsets and our words are inconsistent with his intentions. He has "made clean" everyone who belongs to Jesus. Even if we don't get along well with some believers, we should remember that they, like us, have been made new. They, too, are heirs of salvation and our brothers and sisters in Christ.

The Lord longs to see our thoughts and our speech reflect the expansive love in his heart. Our words have power! "Death and life are in the power of the tongue" (Proverbs 18:21). We have a tremendous responsibility: with our words we can either build up or tear down.

Every day offers us opportunities to respond to this choice. How will you think and speak about God's children today? Can you use your words to encourage, to build up, to declare what God thinks about them? Ask the Spirit to help you think as he does about your fellow believers. As your mind is renewed, you will find it easier to speak words of love, speech that creates spaces of love, unity, and healing.

"Lord, purify my heart and help my words to build up your people!"

I think this article is so relevant to our society and our everyday lives. Think about it. Do your actions and words build up other people? Do you need to make any changes in your life? Pray and ask God to help you and all people to build up and not tear down with our words and actions. This can apply to how we think, talk or act towards politics, immigration, and our individual prejudices and how we think and act towards people who are different from us. As Knights of Columbus, we can set good examples for others if we live our lives with love towards everyone, just as God desires!

Worthy State Deputy Rick Hughes observed in February's State Zoom meeting that "the principle of unity is the hardest to implement in the Order." All too often, our human frailty assents to sins of pride, envy, and wrath that damage our efforts to serve our Lord and His Church in fraternity with brother Knights and faithful.

I urge brother Knights and faithful to read Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly's column "The Gift and Task of Unity," found in the April edition of *Columbia* and online at <https://www.kofc.org/en/news-room/columbia/2024/april/fromthedesk04012024.html>. Our Supreme Knight asks us

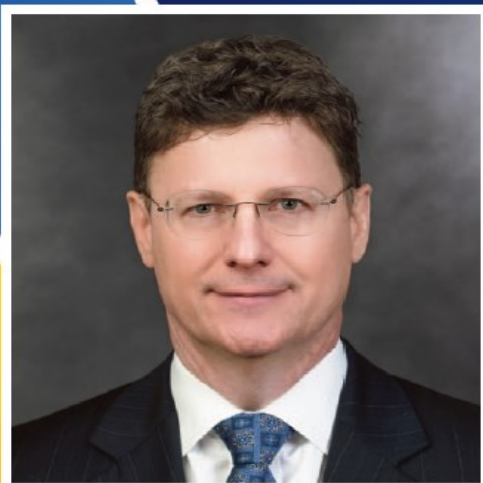
to revisit our attitudes and actions which threaten our ability to serve in unity. Some excerpts:

- "Through our baptism, each of us has a responsibility to pray for and foster the unity that Christ wills for the Church. The simple truth is that when we are harsh or habitual in our criticisms of the Church and its leaders, we are damaging the body of Christ."
- "The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (2477), meanwhile, warns against rash judgment, detraction and calumny, offenses against truth that cause a cascade of even greater division. On a personal level, our cynicism can lead us into a spiritual desert that extinguishes the joy and hope we are meant to radiate as Christians. Tragically, it may even give others, including our children, a reason to abandon the faith entirely."
- "We should ask ourselves: Can we do more to help our parish and our pastor? Can we turn off the noise from social media and news outlets and turn toward the voice of Christ in silent prayer? Can we offer a rosary for the health of our marriage and our family or devote an hour to Eucharistic adoration for the strength of our priests, our bishops and the pope? Prayer from the heart, far more than criticism, has real power to change things."

At our State Convention over Memorial Day weekend, we will reflect on our service to God and neighbor – the works He prepared for us, and the challenges we faced. As we look forward to a new fraternal year of service, let us remember the lesson on Unity from the Exemplification of Charity, Unity and Fraternity: "When we stand united, our Order is a force for the defense of our faith, our families, and one another."
